A Message from Robert D. Bender, Supervisor of Elections


As the new Supervisor of Elections in Escambia County, I want to thank the voters, election workers, and staff for making my first election cycle a successful one. This report highlights our accomplishments during the Presidential Election. It gives you a glimpse into what it takes to put on an election.

During 2024, our office ran three full elections: the Presidential Preference Primary in March, the Primary in August, and the General in November. Each one of these elections includes vote-by-mail, early in-person voting, and Election Day in-person voting. Each of these requires extensive staff time and strenuous testing. We also implemented Clear Ballot, an independent auditing system to audit 100% of our ballots, which resulted in a 99.99% accuracy rate.


Looking ahead to 2026, we are continuing to improve our processes and strive for better service to our voters and our community.

Thank you for being a part of the Democratic process, and allowing us to serve you.




REGISTERED VOTERS AND TURNOUT




VOTING METHOD




REGISTERED VOTERS BY PARTY AFFILIATION




TOTAL BALLOTS CAST BY PARTY AFFILIATION




VOTING METHOD BY PARTY AFFILIATION

VOTER TURNOUT BY AGE GROUP AND PARTY






BUSIEST ELECTION DAY POLLING LOCATION

EVID



The EViD system is a network of electronic poll books at voting sites communicating with each other and with the county's voter registration system. The electronic poll books—EViD stations—allow Election Workers to quickly check in voters during early voting and on Election Day.



ExpressVote

89 Units

The ExpressVote is a ballot marking device for use by all voters, especially those who are unable to mark their ballot on their own. Voters can use the touchscreen to make their ballot choices. Headphones and a tactile keypad are available for voters who require an audio ballot.



DS300 Tabulator

132 Units

The DS300 Ballot Tabulator is an electronic voting system that uses an optical scanner to read marked paper ballots and tally the results. This system allows for paper ballots to be immediately tabulated at the polling site or Early Vote location and notifies voters of any marking errors.

ELECTION DAY PRECINCT TEAMS

CLERK

The Clerk supervises the polling location. resolves voter issues and reconciles ballot totals.





EVID SUPERVISOR

The EViD Supervisor assists the Clerk in managing polling locations and completing tasks.



EVID OPERATOR

The EVID Operator operates the electronic poll book, confirms voter eligibility and signature, and issues voting passes.

EQUIPMENT OPERATOR

The Equipment Operator sets up and assists voters with the ExpressVote and ballot tabulation equipment.




BALLOT ISSUER


The Ballot Issuer collects voting passes from voters and issues ballots.
